The 1899 American steamer (center and top right) wheels have been completely re -done since 2011. Three layers of designs were recorded and removed. Paint color was matched to the original and 5-6 coats of enamel were applied by brush. Then in April of 2013 two sets of 'decals' made by Ken Soderbeck were attached. Days later, master

The 1933 Mack water tower tractor required new linings and seals; paid for from operating funds.



### **EVENTS**

### **EXHIBITS**

A tribute to the fire fighters who became soldiers during the Defense of Baltimore in 1814 has original documents on loan from the Maryland Historical Society and Russ Sears. Also in the Rare Prints Gallery is a new exhibit on Chief Charles Holloway and the veterans' assn that started the legacy of collecting in 1887. In the Special Exhibits Room is a display on fire boats. All of these exhibits required huge quantities of work by a team of people.

### CAMPAIGN for a new FIRE ALARM OFFICE

### INDICATOR NEEDED!

In the 1880s the most important device in an office or fire house was the Indicator, as seen to the left. This gadget displayed the incoming Box Number. Gongs made noise; indicators recorded numbers. ### TOUR PROGRAMS FOR ALL AGES

"Teaching fire safety and the history of the urban fire service to students at all comprehension levels."





Every year between 3,500 and 5,000 schoolchildren, special needs children and adults take one of the six tours and activities the Fire Museum offers as part of its educational mission. This year, our three tour guides have given over 280 tours so far. Among the new tours and new activities offered are:

The Command and Reform Tour, which discusses how early 19<sup>th</sup> century firemen fought fires and each other; how the citizens organized a movement to remove several rowdy fire companies; and created the paid Baltimore City Fire Department of today. This tour meets state curriculum goals in Political Science, History and Geography.

The Character Traits of Good Citizens Tour uses the Great Baltimore Fire of 1904 to highlight traits exhibited by citizens and fire fighters as they fought the third worst fire in U.S. history. Students learn by example the meaning of traits such words as being" Brave", having "Perseverance," and being "Cooperative" through the actions of the citizens and firemen. They decide what traits are the most important in an emergency. This tour meets state goals in the new Character Development curriculum.

The Fire Rescue Game teaches children how to self-rescue and practice saving their teacher from the "burning building." Students dress up in turnout gear and simulated SCBA packs, and do fire rescue drills. This add-on activity to the Bucket Brigade Tour was also very popular as part of the Summer Activities Programs every Friday, June through August at 11 am.


